Maximum dimensions and weight allowed on an annual oversize/overweight permit is: Length - 120', Width - 13' 5", Height -15'5", Weight - 156,000 pounds.

Carrier will be responsible for routing and checking with the department for updates prior to move. Permit is not valid for travel on interstate highways.

It will be the responsibility of the carrier to route themselves around low clearances, construction projects, embargoed roads and bridges. If carrier demonstrates inability to self route permit will be denied.

Permits can be issued only for transporting, single articles that exceed statutory size unless the inclusion of additional articles does not cause the size or weight to further exceed the statutory limits.

All information applicable to a given permit is required and is public information. Failure to complete the application as required will result in denial of permit.
